Milwaukee Swims

YMCA partnership with the Milwaukee County Parks

As a leader in swim education, the Milwaukee Y teaches nearly 4,000 children and adults to swim each year. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has warned that drowning is one of the top three causes of unintentional injury death for people 29 and younger, and for African-American children aged 5 to 19, the drowning rate is five times that of white children. Nationally, 70% of African-American children, 58% of Hispanic children and 40% of white children have little or no swimming ability and are at risk of water-related injury or death. The Y's "Milwaukee Swims" partnership with the Milwaukee County Parks will bring affordable swim and water safety lessons to more sites throughout the County in an effort to help reverse these preventable and troubling trends.
