YMCA of Metropolitan Milwaukee Day Camp and Reduced-Cost Swim Lessons Kick Off for Summer!

Day Camp Begins TODAY, June 11 & Safety Around Water Starts June 18

WHAT:

The YMCA of Metropolitan Milwaukee is hosting six camps throughout Milwaukee, including its newest addition at Falk Park in Oak Creek. Children enrolled in YMCA of Metropolitan Milwaukee Day Camp will explore nature, participate in team-building activities, and create memories that will last a lifetime. Each child receives breakfast, lunch and an afternoon snack.

Through **Safety Around Water**, the **YMCA of Metropolitan Milwaukee** is offering eight swim lessons for the reduced-cost of \$5 per person or \$10 per family. Lessons are available for children ages six years and older, as well as non-swimming adults.

WHO:

The YMCA of Metropolitan Milwaukee served 903 individual children through our **Day Camp** program in 2017. The YMCA of Metropolitan Milwaukee also taught over 4,000 individuals to swim in our swim lessons program in 2017, while 1,300 children learned to swim through our **Safety Around Water** program.

WHEN:

YMCA of Metropolitan Milwaukee Day Camp begins today, Monday, June 11 and runs Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

WHY:

For children ages 1 to 14, fatal drowning remains the second leading cause of unintentional injury-related death, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Adding to this grave problem is the fact that nationally, 70 percent of African-American children, 58 percent of Hispanic children and 40 percent of white children have little or no swimming ability.

Research has also shown that children in a lower socioeconomic climate may, on average, begin every new school year two months behind their peers due to summer learning loss because of lack of resources in our urban areas.

The YMCA of Metropolitan Milwaukee is committed to reversing these preventable and troubling statistics by offering **Safety Around Water**, a program that's designed to bring swim lessons throughout Milwaukee, and by offering **Day Camp** activities that incorporates education, social interaction, physical fitness and personal growth.
